## PRIVATE RIADS

This is the ultimate luxe retreat designed as a small medina [old town] within Marrakech's own vibrant medina. 53 terracotta-coloured riads with their own distinct characters, each three storeys and furnished with rich, vibrant colour schemes with silks, brocades and hand crafted furniture.

Discretion, decadence and intimacy reign in these mini private palaces which range from one to four bedrooms.

A butler is assigned to each riad to cater for guests' every whim and they carry out their duties while keeping out of sight using a discreet network of underground marble passages.

Arranged around a central open air courtyard each residence has a visitors' lobby, living room (complete with stationary personalised with the guests' names on the beautiful carved wooden desk) and a dining room as well as an outdoor patio. The luxurious bedrooms and master bedroom –

including a walk-in wardrobe, a bed fit for a queen, sunken bath and separate rain fall shower – are housed on the first floor.

The roof terraces with pool, sun loungers and cabanas are the perfect sun-drenched spot and the crowning glory of the riads with stunning views across the magical city of Marrakech.

## REGAL DINING

Dine like an A-lister at the hotel's three superb restaurants – offering traditional Moroccan and gourmet cuisine – supervised by Michelin-starred chef Yannick Alleno.

Le Grande Table Marocaine executes timeless recipes with culinary newbies creating a marriage full of unforgettable dishes, while La Grande Table Francaise delivers a mouthwatering French experience. Breakfast and lunch is served under the shade of olive trees at The Table and guests can also enjoy three styles of afternoon tea at the resort – Moroccan, French and British – or relax in the Chimney Lounge in the evenings while jazz tunes tinkle from the piano.

## TEMPLE TO WELLNESS

Set in the secluded leafy courtyard, the chic spa is a contemporary design marvel in itself

with the white lattice like structure created around an atrium bathed by the warm Moroccan sun.

The Escape Hammam is the undeniable star of the spa, invigorating even the weariest traveller as it uses secrets of ancient traditions to deliver smoother, silkier skin.

With over 101 treatments on offer, all which can be tailor-made, guests will be spoilt for choice before endless cups of delicious Moroccan mint tea are served in the sumptuous four poster rest beds (complete with curtains for privacy) post treatment.

The fragrant Moorish gardens, fountains, pools and Andalusian courtyards plus all the stunning touches create a tranquil haven. But it's really the phenomenal attention to detail throughout the lavish property including the stained glass windows and the mother-of-pearl embellishment that give this five-star hotel the real wow factor.
